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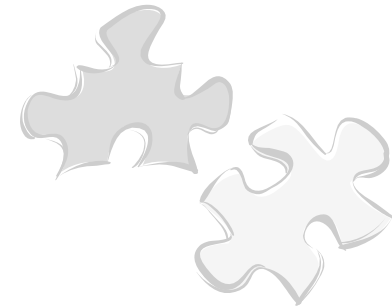

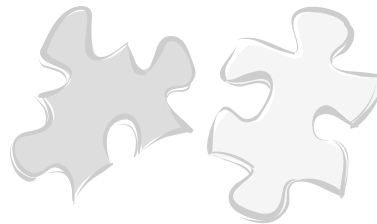

Autism Information Specialist Program

Autism Information Specialists contract with the Autism Society of Maine and have varying degrees of expertise. Some prefer to concentrate on attending educational and vocational planning meetings such as Early Childhood Team meetings (ECT's), Pupil Evaluation Team meetings (PET's), Person Centered Planning meetings (PCP's) or participating in developing Individual Educational Plans (IEP's). Others opt to work with law enforcement and corrections professionals who interact with individuals who have Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). Some Autism Information Specialists enjoy public speaking and give presentations to various agencies and the community on topics related to autism.

Autism Information Specialists also provide information and resources for schools, the work place and the community to foster empathy, understanding, and compassion for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders.

We encourage you to take advantage of the services offered through our Autism Information Specialist Program. Although they do not serve as advocates or case managers, they are an invaluable resource to families and individuals with autism, professionals, and service providers seeking support.
