Legislative News By Betsy Mahoney

The State Budget

The 130th legislative session will come to a close by mid-June, but not before a flurry of budget-related issues are resolved, some of which would impact the autism community.

Chief among them were the Governor's "change package" budget, introduced in early May. The budget included increases to raise wages for direct support professionals, but only enough to bring DSP pay up to the minimum wage. By contrast, the HHS Committee passed LD 1573, setting wages for MaineCare funded DSPs at 125% of the minimum wage.

ASM testified at the Budget hearing on May 20 in favor of the 125% of the minimum wage. The Appropriations Committee will make the final recommendation and send it the Governor's to sign or veto.

Restraint and seclusion legislation

Maine has one of the highest rates of restraint and seclusion of school children of any state in the country. Rep. Rebecca Millett introduced a bill, Keeping All Students Safe, that would ban seclusion and limit restraints. The bill requires the Department of Education to collect data on these incidents and make that information available to the public.

The bill proved to be very controversial, with special purpose private preschools testifying against it, but the bill passed the Education Committee. As of this writing, it has not reached the floor of the House or Senate. ASM testified in favor of the bill and worked with a coalition to prepare written materials for legislators about the bill.

The American Rescue Plan

The ARPA, passed by Congress this spring, provides states with a 10% FMAP (federal matching rate) increase for one year for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS). These funds must be used to support Home and Community-Based Services, including home healthcare, case management, school-based services, HCBS waiver services (such as Section 21 residential and Sec. 29 community-based services). States must submit an initial spending plan and narrative to CMS by June 12. ASM is working with other disability rights advocates to provide input to the Office of Aging and Disability Services

Early childhood education services reorganization

Board member and former State Rep. Richard Farnsworth has been involved in a multi-year effort to transform the administration of early childhood services. This year, the Education Committee considered a bill that directs the DOE to



establish a process and a timeline for transitioning early child-hood special ed services for children from 4 years of age to under 6 years of age from CDS to school administrative units. ASM testified in favor of the bill. The Education Committee is still being working on the bill.

(Virtual) Capitol Hill visits

ASM board members and staff attended the Arc's virtual Disability Policy Seminar in April. As part of that activity, Mainers visited with Senators King, and with staff for Rep. Pingree and Rep. Golden. Among the topics discussed were Home and Community-Based Services under the American Rescue Plan the Congress passed this spring; issues related to direct support professionals; the ABLE Act; and education-related concerns.

In May, ASM Board and staff and Kim Musheno of the Autism Society of America met with Sen. Susan Collins. The group asked her to consider co-sponsoring the Transformation to Competitive Integrated Employment Act, which prohibits companies from offering sub-minimum wages to people with disabilities and provides funding and support to help states create jobs within the regular labor market (as opposed to "sheltered workshops" that employ only people with disabilities).






Winkle In The Lunchroom


